This document serves as a "snapshot" of our 2023 State of the County Health (SOTCH) Report. A SOTCH provides an annual update on emerging issues, new initiatives, and progress made in addressing our county's health priorities.

What we've accomplished so far:

- Breastfeeding Friendly Community Project was completed in 2022; 8 work spaces created lactation friendly locations.
- 108 participants completed pre health assessments & screenings offered as part of the Elevate 828 wellness program that began in September 2023.
- 47 students participated in Healthy Snack Master Competition at Blue Ridge School.

- 2 Lock Your Meds NC billboards and an opioid related article were shared.
- JCPS SHAC reviewed & selected educational vaping materials to be shared with students and guardians.
- Tall Cop Says Stop event was hosted at SMHS, over 100 community members were in attendance.
- 23 lbs of medications were taken back at 2 Operation Medicine Take Back events.
- 20 Naloxone education events were held and over 390 kits were distributed.

- View From Here, a health communication campaign, was shared on social media.
 The mental health related posts received 524 clicks in 2 campaigns from April/May & August/September.
- Music for Mental Health fundraiser and awareness event was held over 2 days with over 100 participants.
- JCPS completed walking trails/ outdoor learning areas to be used by students and staff thru grant funding provided by the Great Smokies Health Foundation.
